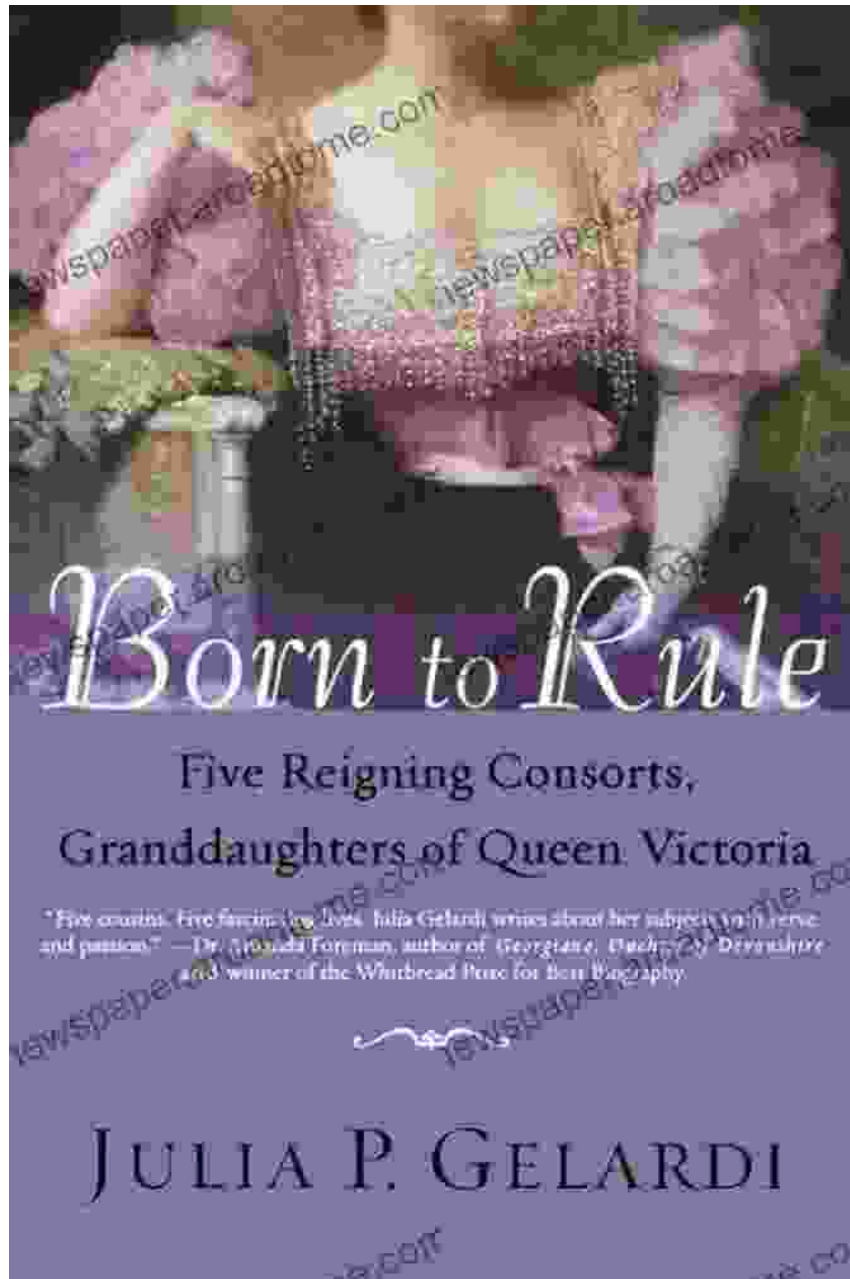
## **2. Marie of Romania**

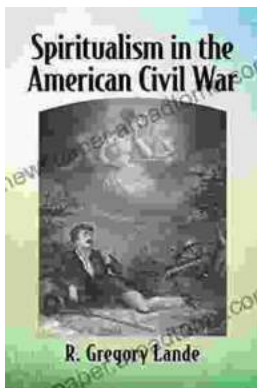
