Kauflin offers a number of practical solutions for creating music that is both meaningful and engaging. He suggests that we:

- Choose songs that are simple, singable, and meaningful.
- Sing them well, with passion and accuracy.
- Use music in the right way, to lead people into worship, to teach them about God, and to build community.
- Take music seriously, by investing in good musicians, providing adequate training, and giving music the time and attention it deserves.


