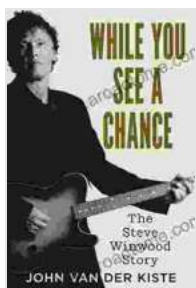

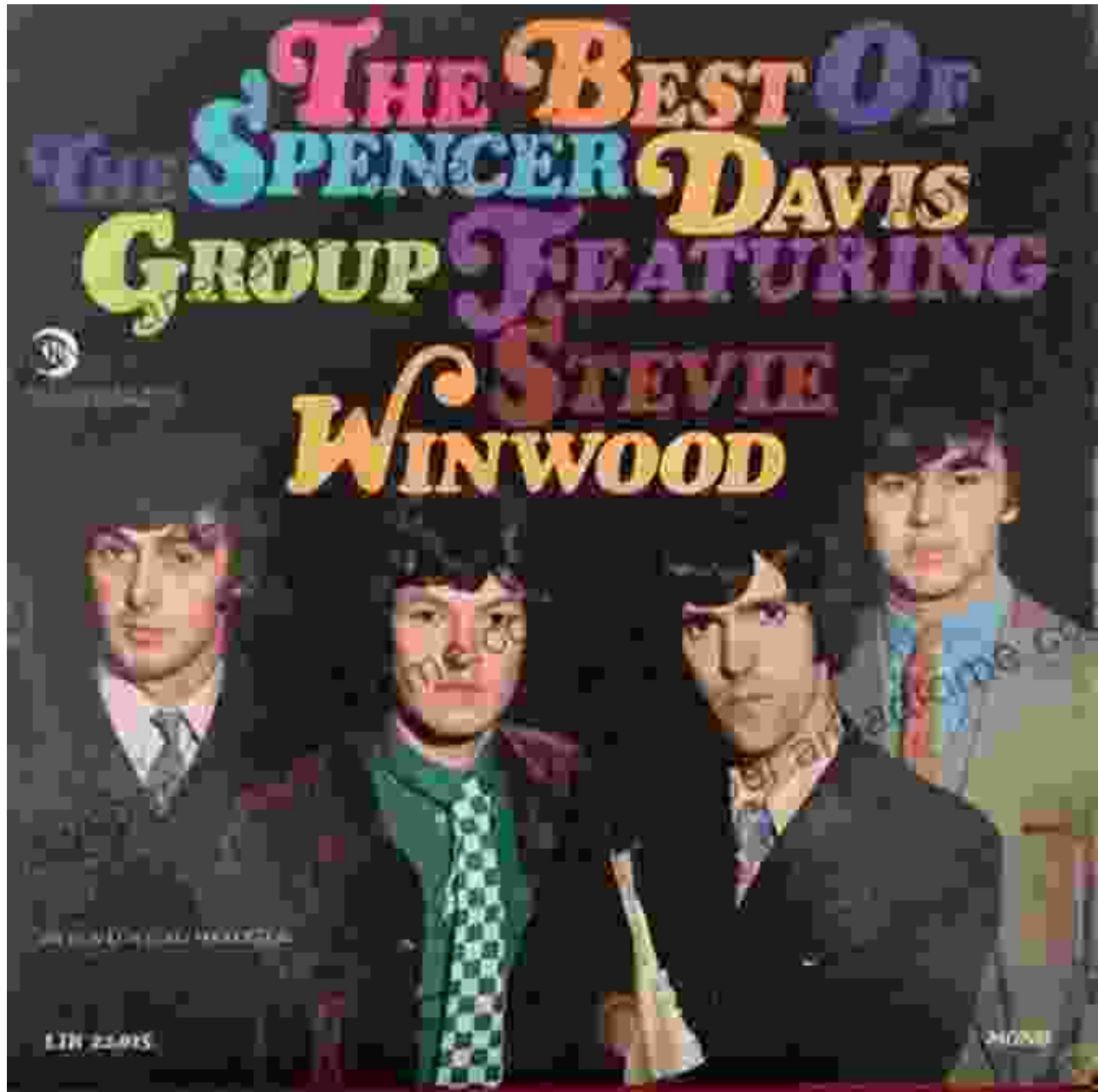


The Early Years

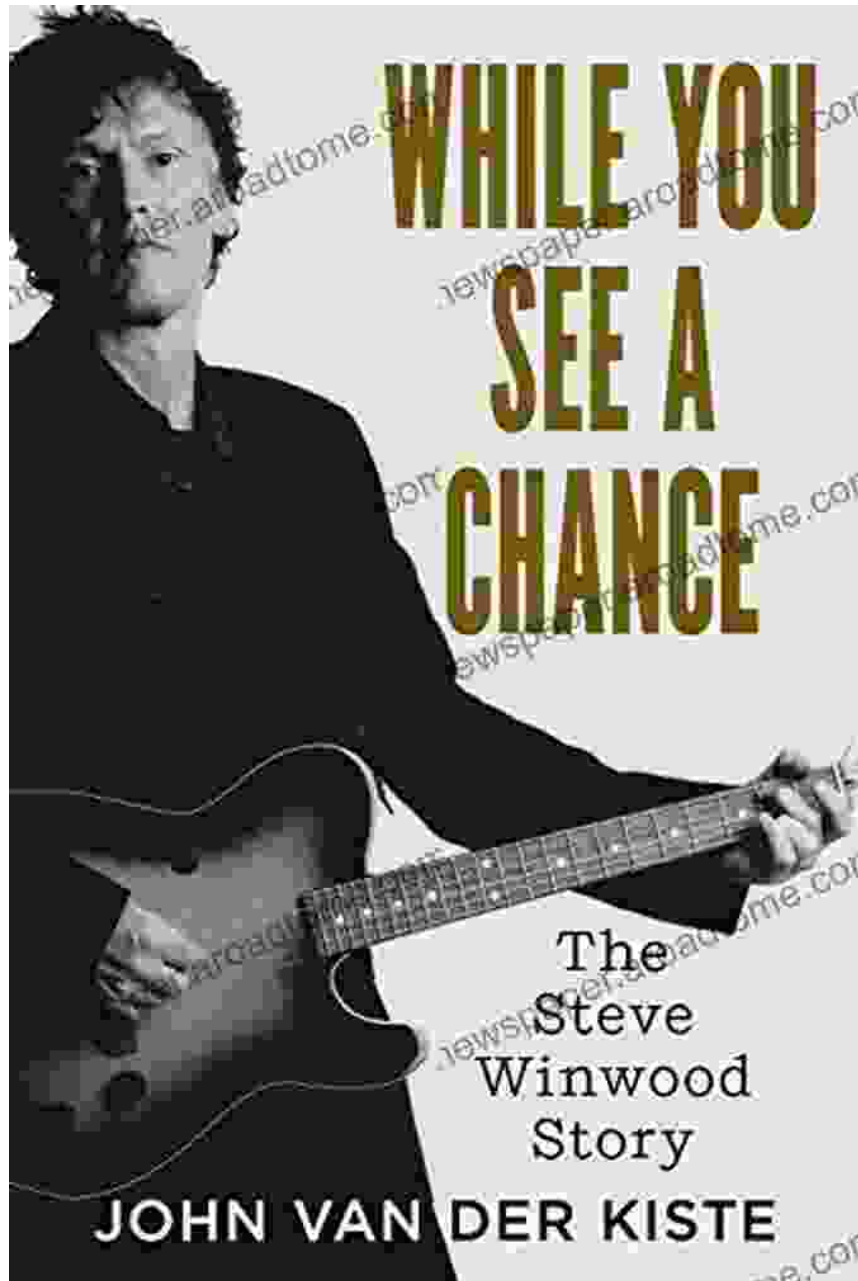
Steve Winwood performing with the Spencer Davis Group.

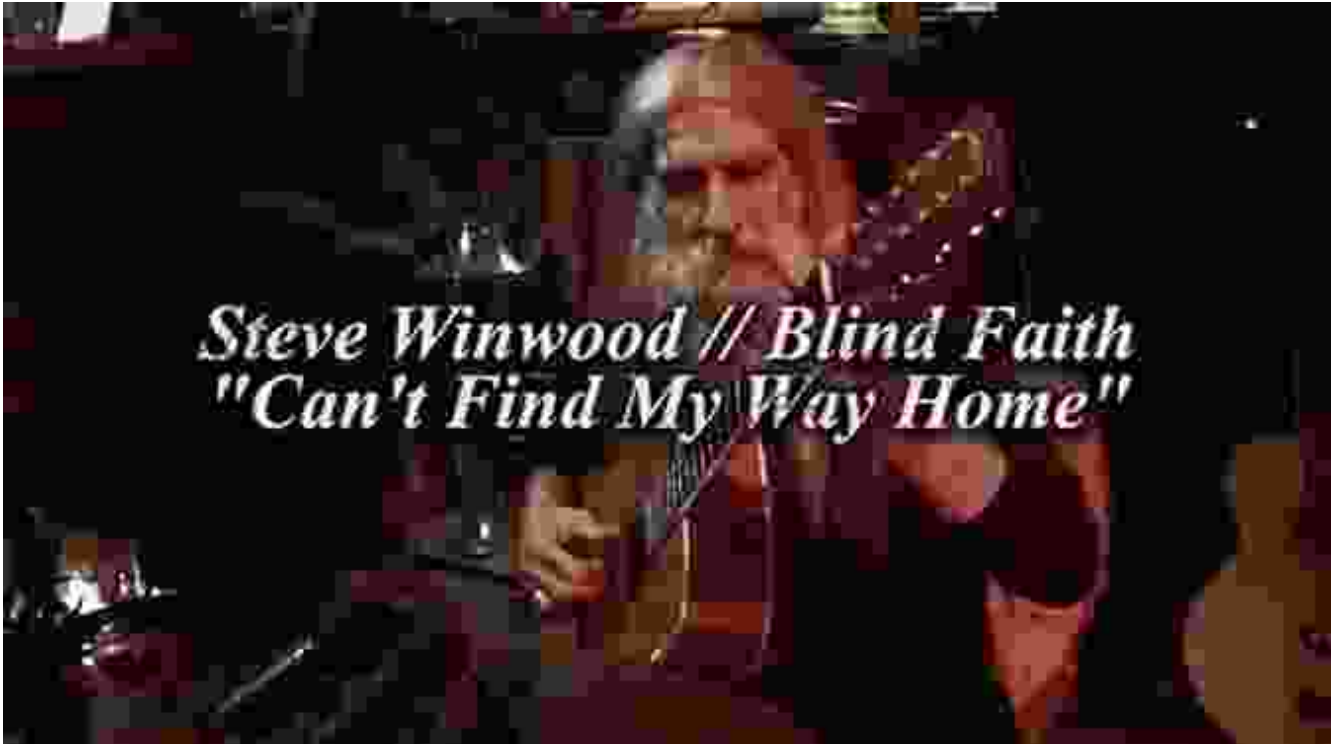

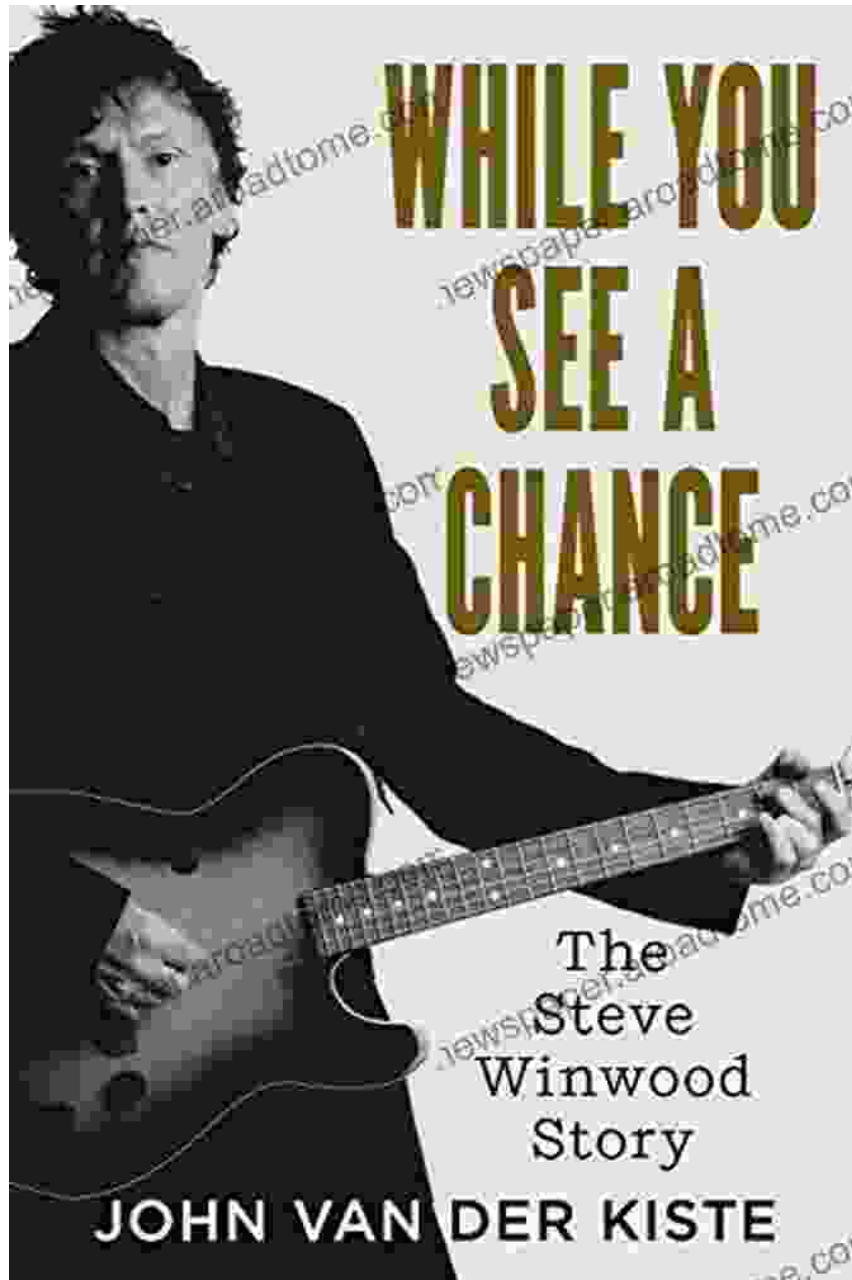
Despite their success, Blind Faith disbanded after just one album. Winwood and Clapton both went on to have successful solo careers.

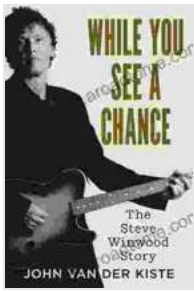

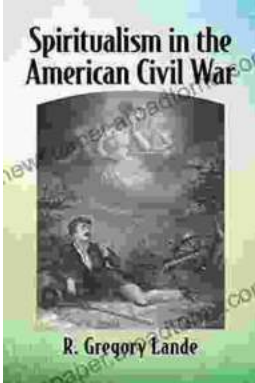
